CNY Rotary Update

Nominations Now Open for CNY Rotary Leadership Positions

The CNY Rotary Steering Committee has opened up nominations for several leadership roles on the future team and all qualified members of Districts 7150, 7170 and 7190 are encouraged to put their name in the hat. All submissions will go through the CNY Rotary Nominating committee, which is comprised of the three Immediate Past District Governors (who cast one vote in the case of a tie), the three District Governor Elects, three Assistant Governors, three immediate Past Club Presidents, three Past District Governors and the three sitting District Governors are non-voting members. You can see that there are three of each position, with one hailing from each of our current three districts.

CNY Rotary President (formerly known as District Governor)

We are seeking nominations for the President of CNY Rotary for 2025-26 and this can happen one of three ways:

- 1 Your club can nominate you (with your approval)
- 2 You can go to your club to ask them to nominate you
- 3 The nominating committee can nominate someone directly (with their approval)

The basic qualifications for the role are that you have to have been an active member for at least seven years before your term begins and you have to have served a full year as club president. Details on the nominating process, a job description and answers to Frequently Asked Questions about being President, as well as the necessary forms are all available at www.cnyrotary.org under the Nominations tab. If you are considering this position, you can reach out to anyone on the Steering Committee to discuss if it would be a good fit for you. It is a serious leadership position and you should know what it will entail before stepping up. It will also be a seriously rewarding experience!

CNY Rotary Committee Chairs

Several committee chair positions are also open to nominations during this time: Finance, Foundation, Youth Exchange, Public Image, Membership, Training, and Diversity, Equity and Inclusion. Each of these roles require some Rotary experience in that area of expertise and come with opportunities for additional training. For these positions, you can self-nominate or have someone nominate you. Please do not nominate people without their permission. The nominating committee will be going through all submissions for these roles, with the top candidates to be interviewed by the CNY Rotary Steering Committee later this month. Check out the Nominations tab at www.cnyrotary.org for job descriptions and the online form for nominations.

Nomination Deadline is May 15

The deadline for clubs to nominate a CNY Rotary President or for someone to nominate themselves to a chair position will be Monday, May 15th. This is because the goal is to have all positions filled by the start of the new Rotary year. This gives the new volunteer leaders time to plan for attending training in the fall and to start work on building the rest of the committee. Each committee will now be bigger and that means many more opportunities to serve. If none of the roles described here sound like you, but you know you want to help at the district level, please keep following along because the call for you to get involved will be going out in the next phase.

Please be sure to <u>follow us on Facebook</u> and/or Instagram as we put out reminders and helpful information about the work being done to become CNY Rotary. Our goal is that people feel informed and have plenty of opportunities to engage, ask questions and get involved.



A Rotary Adventure of a Lifetime

Let me begin by describing the predicament of the schoolgirls I met in Uganda. Imagine trying to deal with your menstruation when you have no supplies other than rags, leaves, mud, and perhaps a plastic bag. The first time the boys laugh at you because your dress is stained will probably be your last day in school. A March 2022 article in the Rotary magazine stated that many girls in Uganda drop out of school, marry early, have early pregnancies, all for the lack of a way to handle their menstruation. The Rotary magazine went on to say that some girls turn to prostitution, simply to afford menstrual products.

Our Rotary District 7190 found a solution. An inexpensive (\$5), long-lasting (5-yrs), washable menstrual kit. The MoonCatcher Kit was designed right here in Schenectady by Ellie von Wellsheim.

This March of 2023, I had the pleasure of traveling to Uganda with Ellie. This was my 3rd trip to Africa with her, but this time, we started work on the recently approved Rotary Global Grant GG1872625. Sometimes we Rotarians like to say our Rotary work is worth it if even one life is changed. This \$41,000 grant will provide MoonCatcher Kits to over 5,000 girls. In addition, 2 schools are being provided with sewing machines, instructions, and enough material to make 200 additional kits per school.

Although not part of the Grant, Ellie and I hand-carried seventy microSD memory cards, to be delivered to seventy schools. Each memory card is filled with eRotary's Knowledge Empowerment Software (KES). The memory cards are inserted into Android devices. The educational apps, books and videos are ideal for students like these who do not have access to the Internet. Here you see Ellie & Phoebe learning how to access the index of materials by grade or by subject. Report of Ambulance Commissioning in Les Cayes, Haiti

One of the great blessings of being a member of the Schenectady Rotary Club is that we recognize that while we do good works in our community, we have a broad definition of the word "community" to extend well outside of our city limits. Specifically, we received a plea for help from our Rotarian friend, Dr. Dorgu Petit-Homme of Les Cayes, Haiti following the devastating earthquake of August 14th, 2021, that left 2,248 dead, 12,763 injured and 329 missing. Property damage was severe, estimated at \$1.5 billion. 3 days later Hurricane Grace struck causing mudslides and significant flooding. Our club responded by raising \$8,000 for food and water. Additionally, we located a used ambulance through the generous donation of the Community Emergency Corps of Ballston Spa. Another blessing was a donation of 500 pounds of medical supplies thanks to the Corp and Ballston Spa Rotary, along with a used ultrasound machine donated by Ellis Hospital. We then received a commitment from District Governor Bruce McConnelee on behalf of District 7190 to pay the shipping costs to get the ambulance to Haiti. Even though it shipped around the gang-controlled neighborhood and then driven 8 hours to the southern tip of Haiti to the Rotary-built clinic in Les Cayes.

The commissioning ceremony was attended by PDG 7020 Robert Leger (2017-18), past Camp-Perrin Rotary President Dorgu Petit-Homme and several local dignitaries. Schenectady Rotarian Brian Merriam attended remotely and spoke via cell phone and with the aid of a translator. All in attendance praised Schenectady Rotary and the tenacity of getting the ambulance to Les Cayes despite so many obstacles and hardships. This is the first ambulance provided to the community in recent years and is a vast improvement over the backs of pickup trucks and handcarts typically used to transport the sick and injured.

Rotary has again made a huge difference and has made the definition of "community" a blessing to hundreds whose lives may now be saved thanks to our timely response. Thank you to all who helped in this effort!


