#### Rotary's Wheel Emblem:

A wheel has been the symbol of Rotary since our earliest days. The first design was made by Chicago Rotarian Montague Bear, an engraver who drew a simple wagon wheel, with a few lines to show dust and motion. The wheel was said to illustrate "Civilization and Movement." Most of the early clubs had some form of wagon wheel on their publications and letterheads.

Finally, in 1922, it was decided that all Rotary clubs should adopt a single design as the exclusive emblem of Rotarians. Thus, in 1923, the present gear wheel, with 24 cogs and six spokes was adopted by the "Rotary International Association."

A group of engineers advised that the geared wheel was mechanically unsound and would not work without a "keyway" in the center of the gear to attach it to a power shaft. So, in 1923, the keyway was added and the design which we now know was formally adopted as the official Rotary International emblem.

#### Club Singing:

Harry Ruggles was the fifth man to join Paul Harris in the conversations that led to the formation of the first Rotary club in Chicago in 1905. Harry was a fellow who enjoyed singing, and this was a popular activity at the turn of the century. At an early meeting of the fledging group, Harry jumped on a chair and urged everyone to join him in a song.

Group singing soon became a traditional part of each Rotary meeting. The custom spread to many of the clubs in the United States and is still a popular fellowship activity in the Rotary meetings of such diverse countries as Australia, Japan, Nigeria, New Zealand and Canada. Some clubs sing a national song as the formal opening of the meeting.

# Tours in Iraq Dr. Kevin Costello

Dr. Kevin Costello, a geriatric physician from Cohoes, spoke to our Rotary club about his tours in Iraq.

Dr. Costello began his talk by giving a little history about himself, and about the type of medicine he practices. He specializes in geriatrics - a branch of medicine that focuses on health care of the elderly. He calls on patients that have a problem getting out of the house. He provides care to them from the time they leave the hospital until they can return to their primary care physician.

#### **First Tour:**

In 1999, Dr. Costello joined the Army reserve. After 911, he was deployed to Iraqi for a three month tour. First, he was a surgeon for an MP battalion.

Then he was transferred to a prison camp named <u>Camp Bucca</u>. He ran a battalion aid station which provided medical care to detainees. Many of them were older, so he had a chance to provide some geriatric care.

The aid station was supposed to provide only <u>Second Echelon care</u>, like first aid. <u>Since Third Echelon care</u> (facilities capable of providing in-patient medical care) was 50 miles

away in <u>Basra</u>, they would have to convoy detainees to Basra when they needed more care. Dr. Costello was involved in eight different convoys. Dr. Costello was at Camp Bucca when <u>Mission Accomplished</u> was declared in May 2003.

#### Second Tour:

Dr. Costello was stationed at <u>Abu Ghraib</u> prison, a Third Echelon care facility. He ran the Intensive Care unit (ICU). During this tout, he needed the practice critical care services. This tour was longer than the first one. It lasted eight months.

During the 2008 Christmas season, a physician that Dr. Costello served with was killed in Iraq by a mortar.

In conclusion, Dr, Costello explained that military is a close knit family. A special bond is formed with others you serve with in a war. He also explained that the military afforded him the opportunity to develop leadership skills that have helped his civilian career.

Dr. Kevin is currently a Lt. Colonel in the Army Reserve.
