## Counseling Care & Services Receives 2008/9 Award

On August 19<sup>th</sup>, 2009, Marilyn Wheeler, Director accepted a 2008/9 Award from The Rotary Club of Cohoes for Counseling Care & Services.

Marilyn Wheeler, Founding Executive Director of Counseling Care & Services, began her remarks by explaining that they are in their 25<sup>th</sup> year of operation. They started on Remsen Street in Cohoes in 1893. They spent 13 years in the Cohoes Community Center after which they moved to St. John's church on Vliet Blvd.

Counseling Care & Services is a not-for-profit center that provides counseling and psychotherapy for adults, children and families. All of their staff are licensed in their respective fields. Most of their staff have master's degrees and are certified mental health counselors who: evaluate, and treat people in consultation with doctors.

They provide a full range of: individual, marital, family and child related therapy. About 70% of the mental health related services are provided to individuals, and the remaining 30% are provided to families.

They help people with: anxiety disorders and depression. Depression is common among older people because their friends either move away or die, and they are faced with increasing health issues and ailments.

Counseling Care & Services has contracts with several organizations to provide Employee Assistance Program (EAP) services to their staff. Over the years they have had contacts with: several businesses, the New York State Office of Mental Health (OMH), and the Federal Probation Department.

They provide services for OMH to: children from 6 to 17 suffering from mood disorders; and to people who can still work but suffer from recurring mood disorders that affect them on the job. They provide assessment and evaluation services for the Federal Probation Department to for people on probation.

The people they provide services do not live just in Cohoes. Clients live in 12 to 14 surrounding localities including: Waterford, Watervliet and Clifton Park.

In 2000, they established The Play Therapy Center as a way to provide for young children who have severe emotional distress. The Center focuses on activities through which children can tell their own story. One example is a sand box that children from 9 to 10 years of age can pick figures and draw pictures in the sand. Another is Art Therapy, through which children can make things with clay.

The stories that they tell through these venues help our staff enter their world and to determine what is bothering them and issues as they see them. This is helpful information for parents and school advisers in dealing with issues that these children are dealing with.
