Don't Believe the Hype! Angela McFarland, Publisher Ballston Journal

Angela Mc Farland, publisher of the Ballston Journal, spoke to our Rotary Club about truth in newspapers.

Angela began her remarks by explaining that she began her career in print advertising focusing on Columbia, and Rensselaer counties. She became a publisher when she began 'Our Town' Ballston Spa

There is still a market for print media. In the spring of 2009, she became publisher of the Ballston Journal. Charles Hogan, the editor, is the 4th generation of his family that had a connection with this newspaper.

Like many small town newspapers, the Ballston Journal focuses on news and stories about Ballston Spa and the people that live there. Many people turn to the Ballston Journal to find news about what their kids are doing in sports.

There are many forms of media, and Angela does not advocate that one is any better than another. However newspapers haven't got into the financial trouble that General Motors has, nor have they received bailouts from the federal government.

For most advertisers, newspapers have the strongest brand market. They are and have been the longest and are still the strongest media venue that advertisers have. They have the longest successful marketing record as compared to radio, television or the internet. Each time a new method of communication was invented, stories that newspapers are going to fail, would circulate. This happened when radio began, TV, etc. However, newspapers are still around!

Newspapers have creditability and viability. TV stations have 3 or 4 reporters, and on average about 9 items are included in a broadcast. Compare that with the number of articles and stories in a newspaper. They are reliable because they are an 'opt-in' form of media. In this context, 'opt-in' means that the reader chose to pick up and read the newspaper.

She concluded her remarks by explaining that hometown newspapers are on the rise again.
