Highlights

Keynote Speaker – Dennis Crawford:

Dennis Crawford, former district governor of Pittsburgh, PA - District 7300, and the 2010-11 RI Foundation chair for District 7300, was the key note speaker.

Regarding, what Rotary means to him, Dennis explained that as a member of a National Immunization Day (NID) team in Nigeria, he saw school children writing in the dirt or in the air because they did not have pencil and paper to write with. He also told of a 17 year old mother that gave birth to a baby on a straw mat in a hut. Rotary gave him a chance to give back. In the United States we have so much, and in other countries they have so little.

Regarding new members, Dennis explained that clubs must keep them involved through participation in hands on service projects. He also explained that young people want flexible meeting times, low cost lunches, and less time at weekly meetings. E-clubs are a way to do this.
