Cohoes Central School District Proposed 2011/12 Budget Highlights

Bob Libby, Superintendent of the Cohoes City School District provided an overview of the proposed 2011/12 budget.

Priorities:

Bob Libby began his remarks by explaining that budget planning is about understanding competing factors and crafting a budget that will accommodate them. The 2011-12 budget is based on input from the community and school district staff, diminishing state aid, and workshops with the Board of Education that began in the fall of 2010.

The 2011-12 Budget – By the Numbers:

The proposed budget is \$38.2 million, and represents an increase of 1.69% over the 2010-11 budget. The tax levy is \$13.3 million and represents and increase of 2.42% over last year. The projected tax rate increase is 1.85%.

On the expenditure side, instruction, and operation and maintenance decreased from last year, whereas employee benefits (pension benefits and health insurance), transportation and debt service increased over last year. On the revenue side, building aid and real property taxes increased, whereas state aid, refunds, tuition and other decreased from last year. In addition, \$833, 000 in fund balance, representing an increase of 8.89% was still needed to balance to 2011-12 budget.

State Aid – A Moving Target:

Bob Libby explained that state aid is a moving target. For example, in April 2011 he was notified by the State Educating Department that the Cohoes City School District was overpaid \$35,695 in 2002/4, which will be deducted from 2010-11 state aid.

If the Budget is Defeated:

Put up the same budget again; put up a revised budget, or adopt a contingency budget.

Contingency Budget:

Eliminate 'non-contingent' equipment purchases
Eliminate non-education field trips
Eliminate supplies given to students
Charge community groups for use of school district buildings and grounds

School District Savings:

Elimination of 25 positions

Partnering with the City of Cohoes: gas, diesel, road salt; trash removal, etc.

Health care - working to extend the health insurance consortium to include four regional BOCES
