# Cohoes Rotary Club Program 2011-2012



Sonny Daye Perley Rousseau October 12, 2011

Sonny and Perley are professional musicians, they have performed live music for over 27 years. They also operate an entertainment agency. They play Jazz, Bossa Nova, American Songbook Standards, and International Cabaret. They perform at hundreds of libraries every year, they are performing at the Cohoes Public Library fundraiser next week.

Perley stated that she enjoyed Rotary traditions, such as, good news, bad news, and our singing. The fines process was explained to Sonny and Perley.

They began performing Brazilian music approximately 25 years ago. There is a small Brazilian community in the capital region, but they are very active and vivacious. The Brazilian community embraced Perley and tutored her in both the Brazilian culture and language, Portuguese. Perley and Sonny have performed in many Brazilian restaurants in the U.S. As a result of performing international music across the country, they were asked by multiple people if they had been involved with the Rotary Club. Perley began investigating the Rotary Club and found its tenants admirable.

Sonny and Perley have wanted to travel to Brazil for many years. Perley feels she is attached to the country of Brazil in more ways than just her music. She does not know what her mission will be in Brazil, but she believes they are supposed to be there. Not only do they have a deep interest in Brazilian music and culture, but they have also participated in World Vision, a charitable organization through which they have supported needy children in Brazil. They are currently supporting 2 children who live in Brazil. Perley felt the Rotary Club would be a good U.S. connection to have while traveling in Brazil.

In the U.S. in the 1960's, in addition to the British music invasion, there was a Bossa nova musical invasion. One particularly popular band was, Sergio Mendes and Brasil '66. Perley sang a Brazilian song in both Portuguese and English, the song was titled "The Girl from Ipanema" by Antonio Carlos Jobim.

A suggestion was made by Ed Tremblay that Sonny and Perley contact fellow Rotarian, Tony Rivera before traveling to Brazil. Tony's family is from Brazil and he lived in Brazil as part of the Rotary Group Study Exchange. Tony most likely has direct contacts with Rotary clubs in Brazil.

Amy Musiker's sister lives in Brazil. Her sister is former President of an American Society in Brazil.

Chuck Ries informed our speakers that he hosted a foreign exchange student, Alex, who was from Brazil.
