ROTARY'S WHEEL EMBLEM

A wheel has been the symbol of Rotary since our earliest days. The first design was made by Chicago Rotarian Montague Bear, an engraver who drew a simple wagon wheel, with a few lines to show dust and motion. The wheel was said to illustrate "Civilization and Movement."

Most of the early clubs had some form of wagon wheel on their publications and letterheads. Finally, in 1922, it was decided that all Rotary clubs should adopt a single design as the exclusive emblem of Rotarians. Thus, in 1923, the present gear wheel, with 24 cogs and six spokes was adopted by the "Rotary International Association."

A group of engineers advised that the geared wheel was mechanically unsound and would not work without a "keyway" in the center of the gear to attach it to a power shaft. So, in 1923 the keyway was added and the design which we now know was formally adopted as the official Rotary International emblem.

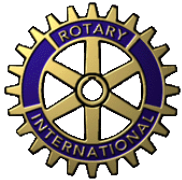

The Van Schaick Mansion is their chapter home. The mansion was built by Anthony Van Schaick between 1735 and 1755. It served as military headquarters during the French and Indian War and the American Revolution. It housed many dignitaries including, Generals Montgomery, Schuyler, Gates, Stark, Morgan, Gansevoort, St. Clair and Benedict Arnold planned the Battle of Saratoga at the mansion. It also served as capitol of NY State for 4 days from August 22-25, 1777.

Ms. Shogan presented photos of the mansion and some of the restorations and updates that their group has done.

The mission statement of their chapter's current project is to collect, preserve, and present the cultural history of Van Schaick Island. The project has been divided into 4 phases.

Phase I: Acquire mansion (2001-2004)

This was accomplished using different funding grants from the State of NY and Cohoes Savings Bank.

Phase II: Categorize and collect historical documents and materials

Phase III: Restoration

Phase IV: Preservation

The list of projects to be completed in phases III and IV include:

- ◆ Refinish wood floors
- ◆ Repair cracks & re-paint walls
- ◆ Slate Roof maintenance
- ◆ Handicap access
- ◆ Replace storm windows
- ◆ Downspouts / gutters
- ◆ Clean & repair foundation
- ◆ Point exterior masonry
- ◆ Insulation
- ◆ Furnace

Maintain and restore Van Schaick Cemetery

In 2011, the National DAR Organization provided a \$2,000 grant to complete the cemetery project. The cemetery project consisted of 25 volunteers and a gravestone specialist, Joe Ferrannini. The project took 3 days to complete. The cemetery was originally refurbished between 1961-1966 by local civic organizations including, the Cohoes Rotary Club. The cemetery fell into a dilapidated state and most of the headstones were broken and disorganized. The project used a plot from the 1966 restoration to reorganize the headstones. It required a lot of painstaking work to repair the headstones. Volunteers used plastic instruments in order to not damage the stones as they were unearthed. The stones and markers were cleaned with small instruments and toothbrushes so the writings were not disturbed. In addition to the tombstone restoration, an Eagle Scout project cleared the walkway and other debris near the cemetery. The stones are replicas from the 1966 restoration, the original stones are in located in the mansion and are in very poor condition.

Other ongoing projects include, establishing a genealogical library of ancestors of the Revolutionary War.

The club asked Ms. Shogan what potential services members of the club could provide. She will send a list of needed projects and these will be discussed with club members. Ms. Shogan looks forward to establishing a relationship with Cohoes Rotary. It was suggested that Cohoes Rotary Club could have a weekly meeting at the Van Schaick Mansion and have a guided tour.
