Dr. Robert Fox specializes in children's vision care. Fox Vision Development works with children who have trouble reading, learning, comprehending. Often children with ADHD also have vision issues. The use of our vision has dramatically changed. In the past people worked outside in natural light while physically moving. They were only looking at things up close for short periods of time. Now people are working up close looking at computers and phones for hours at a time. Eyes are meant to move, and they don't move with close work. People may experience headaches and eye strain. Children may become behavior problems because they can't read well. They may take a long time to do homework. A comprehensive eye exam may show that a child needs glasses or vision therapy.
