Program:

Ben Williams, Executive Director of the Connect Center For Youth talked about the youth drop-in center they are building in the former St. Agnes church in Cohoes. They currently run a backpack food program where during the school year food is sent home each weekend to over 40 families. They are working with the local food bank and the social workers from the Cohoes City School district to determine need. They hope to expand the program to be year-round. The Connect Center has created a STEAM lab creating opportunities for children to participate in fun STEAM activities. They have a full music and recording studio and well as performance spaces. The Connect Center's Tech Hub is hosting a Lego League for middle schoolers to build robotics with Legos. They are working on a program with Siena College that will allow participants to assemble and disassemble computers hoping to give children the skill sets that will help them break the cycle of poverty. The center needs general operating funding. They are looking to partner with Siena College, the Cohoes Housing Authority and LifePath Cohoes on programming.
