Over 100 million Americans are suffering because of the pandemic and other mental health challenges. There has been a 19% increase in anxiety and depression. Currently Counseling Care is doing their sessions by telephone, working with 75-80 individual clients per week. Even if people have internet access platforms like Zoom violate HIPAA regulations. Unfortunately, the most productive work is done face to face. Clients and professionals are all feeling stressed. It is important that people try to interact with others any way they can. Marilyn was happy to see that Rotary continues to meet by Zoom. The camaraderie is crucial in these times. Family counseling cannot be done by telephone. Counseling Care did receive a PPP loan and another loan to keep working. There is such a need for counseling services in Cohoes that they are looking to hire part time staff. Good things are still happening during a bad time.
